

Religious and Political Leaders Appreciate ISKCON at 50th Anniversary Gala in Washington D.C.

Many international religious and political leaders honoured ISKCON Founder Srila Prabhupada's achievements and contributions at a special ISKCON 50th Anniversary Gala Event in Washington D.C. on Tuesday, 13 September.

The event took place in the Presidential Ballroom at the Capital Hilton Hotel on 16th Street. Three blocks from the White House, the Ballroom has hosted every president

since Harry S. Truman and features a permanent eight-foot presidential seal on its wall.

Over 300 people attended the Gala event, seventy-five of them special VIP invitees including religious leaders, religious liberty experts, and members of the media, government representatives and political leaders.

On the sacred day of Govardhan Puja, Bhaktivedanta Manor hosted a gathering at the House of Lords at the Palace of Westminster to acknowledge the 50th anniversary of the incorporation of ISKCON.

The House of Lords is the upper house of the UK Parliament and was built to advise the Crown Imperial since 1295. With the kind permission of the Lord Speaker, the event was hosted in the Principal State Room for an incredible yet intimate gathering of profiled guests renowned in their own disciplines.

Italian Parliament Hosts ISKCON 50 Conference ISKCON News

The Italian Parliament hosted an ISKCON 50 conference entitled, 'Fifty Years of the Krishna Consciousness Movement: Srila Prabhupada, Messenger of Peace and Spiritual Knowledge' at the Chamber of Deputies, one of two houses in the Italian Parliament's bicameral legislature on 5 October 2016.

Around 100 delegates attended the prestigious conference, which was introduced by the Vice President of the Chamber of Deputies. Speakers at the conference included Madhusevita dasa, President of the ISKCON Italian Confederation, and Parabhakti dasa, Vice President of the Italian Confederation of ISKCON.


Srila Prabhupada Uvaca

In 1896, Bhaktivinoda Thakura wanted to introduce this Krsna consciousness movement by sending this book, *Shree Chaitanya Mahaprabhu, His Life and Precepts*. Fortunately, that year was my birth year, and by Krsna's arrangement, we came in contact. I was born in a different family; my Guru Maharaja was born in a different family. Who knew that I will come to his protection? Who knew that I would come in America? Who knew that you American boys will come to me? These are all Krsna's arrangement. We cannot understand how things are taking place.

In 1936 I was in Bombay doing some business. At that time, Guru Maharaja was indisposed [a] little, and he was staying at Jagannatha Puri. So I wrote him [a] letter, "My dear master, your other disciples, *brahmachari, sannyasi*, they are rendering you direct service. And I am a householder. I cannot live with you; I cannot serve you nicely. So I do not know. How can I serve you?" "How can I serve him seriously?" So the reply was dated 13th December, 1936, "My dear such and such, I am very glad to receive your letter. I think you should try to push our movement in English." That was his writing. "And that will do good to you and to the people who will help you." That was his instruction. And then in 1936, on the 31st December – that means just after writing this letter a fortnight before his departure – he passed away. But I took that order of my spiritual master very seriously.

IN FOCUS: RADHA ICKRATH

Gold Coast devotee Radha Ickrath has a cat-like knack of landing on her feet (on many levels) – Damodara Pandit dasa caught up with her this month to find out more ...

When Radha Ickrath attended the New Govardhana Kulimela in 2010 she knew it would one day be her 'special home temple'.

"I immediately loved the devotees, the Deities, the cows and the farm – it's like nowhere else in the world," says Radha.

She headed for Australia after leaving the Bhaktivedanta Manor Community in the UK in 2005 with husband, Damodara dasa, and children Lalita, Radheya and Rohini. They ended up living in Sydney's western suburbs but internally she yearned to return to a vibrant Vaishnava community.

In 2011 Damodara was offered a job in Brisbane and Radha convinced him to make the Gold Coast their base. Radha began working at Govinda's in Surfers Paradise and became more involved with the local devotees and events.

Radha and Damodara's Miami Beach home is now a popular hub of devotional activity with regular *bhajana* nights and an open door policy for devotees who may need an ear, a friend or a plate of *prasada*.

Radha, who is trained in social work, says her dream has always been to open a Community Centre.

"I love devotional arts like cooking, drama and dance and would love to help people by sharing our wonderful culture", explains Radha. "I guess our home is a trial version of that idea."

So what does the future hold for Radha and family? "Well," says Radha, "Soon Rohini will be finished high school on the Gold Coast, so we plan on moving closer to New Govardhana to pursue more devotional goals. So hopefully I can get involved in supporting devotees, producing dramas and short films, cooking classes – all the fun stuff!" 🙏

10 things you didn't know about Radha Ickrath

1. Radha's early childhood name was Usha (and her brother was Aniruddha). Then Srila Prabhupada gave her the name Susasita (meaning one who is chaste to guru's instruction).
2. Srila Prabhupada personally gave Radha cookies and *rasagullas* on a number of occasions.
3. Radha attended ISKCON'S first gurukula in Dallas from 1970 until 1975.
4. When she was 11 Radha's appendix burst and she overheard the doctors say she was close to death – at which point she said, "Please pass my bead bag".
5. Radha received spiritual initiation at the age of 12.
6. Her full initiation name is Radha Priya devi dasi.
7. At age 16, whilst visiting India, Radha contracted typhoid. Upon being diagnosed with the dangerous disease Radha said, "Better pass my bead bag".
8. Radha can speak four languages fluently: English, French, German and Spanish.
9. Radha's parents, Akura dasa and Kandhabasi devi dasi, were the original pioneer devotees of the German Hare Krishna community.
10. In 2010, at the time of the Kulimela, while visiting Currumbin Rock Pools, Radha slipped and took a huge fall but miraculously landed in a pool of water unharmed! After climbing out of the water, Radha was heard to say, "Where's my bead bag?"



As it is with all *kirtana* – the more the merrier. All are invited to attend and inspire our guests and share in this sacred sound vibration. 🙏


